WHAT is a web site?

- ✓ A web site for your library is a presence on the internet.
- ✓ A web site provides information about your library.
- ✓ A web site is a marketing tool for your library.
- ✓ A web site provides a point of contact for reference services.
- ✓ A web site can point users to other sources of information on the Internet.

WHY should my library develop a web site?

- → A web site is a good place to provide information about your library to your local community.
- → A web site also serves as a contact point for persons who may be visiting the area from across the globe.
- → A web site can contain more information than a traditional brochure.
- → A web site does not have hours of operation.

| | Links to search engines |
| | Links organized by category which have been cataloged by staff, such as Recommended Websites for Research |
| | Community information database(s) |
| | Links to business resources - check 25 Ways Your Library Can Support Small Business |
| | Links to full-text magazine database (such as Tennessee Electronic Library; EbscoHost) |
